



Medical and Other Transportation:

November assistance expensed for transportation totaled \$10,207.50 for the month, \$9,987.50 for medical bus tickets and \$220 for other transportation. Year to date transportation totaled \$109,318. Year to date medical transportation totaled \$105,303 and needs based transportation totaled \$4,015.

Medical and Dental Programs:

Medical payments for November amounted to \$2,662 with \$2,092 expensed for Dental and \$570 for Vision. Year to date medical expenses totaled \$49,139. Dental payments year to date are \$35,696 and Vision year to date payments are \$7,820.

\$0 Hearing Aid payments were expensed in November. Year to date Hearing Aid payments totaled \$5,623.

Memorial Affairs Department:

\$5,944.41 was expensed during November, 2011 for indigent veteran funeral expenses, down \$7,239.69 from November, 2010. During November, 7 indigent burials were approved. The burials were for 1 Air Force, 0 Marines, 0 Navy and 6 Army veterans.

Information Systems:

KnowledgeTree

Testing has consistently identified the slow speed of uploading and downloading documents as a problem. Two other pieces of PC-related software also still need to be demonstrated by KnowledgeTree Technical Support staff.

Networking

Further work is needed to determine the hardware and software required to support Microsoft networking in place of the current Novell software.

County Printer Project

New Toshiba printer/copier/scanners were installed. Programming to permit easy scanning of documents was also completed. Our experience so far has been positive.

Ohio Veterans Home Network:

In November, two veterans were transported to the Sandusky home for tours and admission evaluations.

The waiting list for the Ohio Veterans Home includes 18 veterans waiting for nursing home standard care, 8 veterans for nursing home special care, 0 veterans for the domiciliary and 14 for the domiciliary plus.
