



Assistance Department:

June financial assistance totaled \$178,513 down from \$234,455 issued during May and down from \$243,214 issued in June of 2010. Year to date client assistance for 2011 is \$1,268,648 and YTD for 2010 was \$1,271,813, up \$3,165.

During June, 2011, 56 veterans applied for assistance for the first time bringing the 2011 YTD total to 258. Of the 56 new claims, 49 were approved, 0 were partially approved, 3 were denied and 4 were withdrawn. In June, 2010, 45 veterans applied for assistance for the first time bringing the 2010 YTD total to 264.

Medical and Other Transportation:

June assistance expensed for transportation totaled \$9,365.50 for the month, \$8,980.50 for medical bus tickets and \$385 for needs based bus tickets. Year to date transportation totaled \$58,387. Year to date medical transportation totaled \$55,942 and needs based transportation totaled \$2,445.

Medical and Dental Programs:

Medical payments for June amounted to \$14,093 with \$7,610 expensed for Dental and \$860 for Vision. Year to date medical expenses totaled \$29,248. Dental payments year to date are \$19,790 and Vision year to date payments are \$3,835.

\$5,623 in Miscellaneous Medical payments were expensed in June. Year to date Miscellaneous Medical payments are \$5,623

Memorial Affairs Department:

\$13,653.74 was expensed during June, 2011 for indigent veteran funeral expenses, up \$2,394.62 from May, 2010. During June, 15 indigent burials were approved. The burials were for 2 Air Force, 1 Marine, 2 Navy and 10 Army veterans.

Information Systems:

KnowledgeTree

The two new KnowledgeTree upgrades are being processed. Completion is anticipated by the end of July. Technical support from KnowledgeTree has been slow to respond to questions.

Networking issues

We are currently reviewing the I/T Task Force recommendations created in fall 2010 to identify specific changes this agency will be required to make to integrate our I/T capabilities with those of other county agencies. Discussion is needed to determine which of the recommendations are being followed by the new county I/T organization. Education and support will also be required before implementing these changes.

Ohio Veterans Home Network:

In June two veterans were transported to the Sandusky home for tours and admission evaluations.

The waiting list for the Ohio Veterans Home includes 15 veterans waiting for nursing home standard care, 8 veterans for nursing home special care, 0 veterans for the domiciliary and 8 for the domiciliary plus.

Department of Veterans Services:

The next meeting for the Department of Veterans Services Advisory Committee is scheduled for August 18, 2011.
